VILLAGE OF NORTHFIELD RESOLUTION NO. 2017-75

AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A NEW FUND KNOWN AS THE PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS FUND WITHIN THE FINANCIAL RECORDS OF THE VILLAGE

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance recommends and Council determines it necessary to establish a new special revenue fund known as the Property Improvements Fund to be used by the Director of Finance to account for and accumulate resources to be used for the receiving and expending of funds necessary for capital improvements made to Village owned properties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Northfield, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That pursuant to Section 5705.13(C) of the Ohio Revised Code and the Village's Home Rule authority, the Council of the Village of Northfield hereby establishes a special revenue fund known as the Property Improvements Fund in the financial records of the Village for the purposes of accumulating resources for the acquisition, construction, or improvement of property and fixed assets of the Village. The money in the Fund shall come from directing 7.5% of the Village's annual income tax revenue from the prior year into the Fund with the first deposit into the Fund being made in 2017. Money shall be directed to the Fund for a period of 20 years unless otherwise determined by Council, and a maximum of \$5,000,000.00 shall be accumulated in the Fund.

SECTION 2. That all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the deliberation and adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council or any of its legal committees and/or were in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the public peace, health, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Northfield for the reason such legislation is required by law in order to establish this fund and the fund that will assist the Village with planning and allocating funds necessary for capital improvements to Village owned facilities, and this Resolution shall take immediate effect upon its signature by the Mayor, or upon the expiration of time within which it may be disapproved by the Mayor, or upon its passage after its disapproval by the Mayor, as the case may be, pursuant to Village of Northfield Charter Section 4.11.

**VILLAGE OF NORTHFIELD ORDINANCE NO. 2017-77
AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1492 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES RELATING TO NOTIFICATION OF FORECLOSURE FILINGS OR
VACANT PROPERTIES**

WHEREAS, Chapter 1492 of the Codified Ordinances presently requires that notice be provided to the Village in the event of a foreclosure filing related to real property located in the Village, and the Chapter also requires foreclosing entities to provide contact information for the person responsible for maintaining those properties; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to make certain amendments to Chapter 1492 and extend the notice provisions of the Chapter to owners of vacant properties in the Village.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Northfield, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Council hereby amends Chapter 1492 of the Codified Ordinances as is indicated in the attachment hereto.

SECTION 2. That the rest and remainder of the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Northfield shall remain as presently drafted unless inconsistent herewith.

SECTION 3. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were rendered in an open meeting of this Council and/or were in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the public peace, health, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Northfield for the reason that it will assist with maintaining real property in and the aesthetic appearance of the Village, and that this Ordinance shall take immediate effect upon its signature by the Mayor, or upon the expiration of time within which it may be disapproved by the Mayor, or upon its passage after its disapproval by the Mayor, as the case may be, pursuant to Village of Northfield Charter Section 4.11.

Notification of Foreclosure Filing or Vacant Property

- 1492.01 Definitions.
- 1492.02 Notice to Municipality of foreclosure filing and person responsible for maintenance.

1492.01 DEFINITIONS.

(a) "Person" means a natural person or any legal entity, including, but not limited to, a corporation, firm, partnership, trust, or association.

(b) "Vacant" means that no person actually resides in any part of the building or that no person conducts a lawful business in any part of the building.

1492.02 NOTICE TO MUNICIPALITY OF FORCLOSURE FILING AND PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTENANCE.

Any person who files a complaint for foreclosure involving real property located within the Municipality ~~on which there is a building or structure~~ shall notify the Municipality of the filing of the foreclosure complaint and shall file a copy of the complaint with the ~~Finance Director~~ Building and Zoning Inspector within ten days after the filing of that complaint with the ~~relevant~~ court. In addition, any person who files a complaint for foreclosure involving real property located within the Municipality shall notify the Building and Zoning Inspector, within ten days of the date of the filing of the foreclosure complaint, of the name, address, and phone number(s) of the person who is responsible for maintaining the property. Information regarding the person who is responsible for maintaining the property shall be updated with the Village in the event that any such information changes. The notice to the Municipality shall be on a form prescribed by the Municipality.

1492.03 NOTICE TO MUNICIPALITY OF VACANT BUILDING OR STRUCTURE PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTENANCE.

When any real property located within the Municipality on which there is a building or structure becomes vacant, the property owner shall notify the Municipality that the building or structure is vacant within ten days of the building or structure becoming vacant. The notice to the Municipality shall be on a form prescribed by the Municipality.

~~(a) — If the building or structure on the property that is the subject of the foreclosure is vacant at the time the foreclosure complaint is filed, then the person filing the foreclosure complaint shall notify the Municipality of the name, address, and phone number(s) for the person who will be responsible for maintaining the property.~~

~~(b) — If the building or structure on the property that is the subject of the foreclosure becomes vacant at any time after the foreclosure complaint is filed, then the person who filed the foreclosure complaint shall notify the of the name, address, and phone number(s) for the person who will be responsible for maintaining the property.~~

1492.04 NOTICE TO MUNICIPALITY OF VACANT LAND PARCEL AND PERSON RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTENANCE.

Owners of parcels of land within the Municipality that do not contain a building or structure that are not adjacent to parcels owned by that same owner that contain an occupied structure or building shall notify the Building and Zoning Inspector of the name, address, and phone number(s) of the person who is responsible for cutting the grass on and maintaining the vacant parcel. Information regarding the person who is responsible for cutting the grass on and maintaining the parcel shall be updated with the Village in the event that any such information changes. The notice to the Municipality shall be on a form prescribed by the Municipality.

1492.99 PENALTY.

~~No person shall fail to file a complete copy of a foreclosure complaint involving real property located within the Municipality on which there is a building or structure with the Finance Director within ten days after filing the complaint with the relevant court; and/or notify the Municipality of the name, address, and phone number(s) of the person who will be responsible for maintaining the property as required by this chapter. Whoever violates any provision of this section chapter is guilty of failure to file notice of a foreclosure complaint, a misdemeanor of the fourth degree.~~

**VILLAGE OF NORTHFIELD ORDINANCE NO. 2017-78
AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE ENACTING CHAPTER 889 OF THE CODIFIED
ORDINANCES PROHIBITING MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATORS,
PROCESSORS, AND RETAIL DISPENSARIES FROM LOCATING AND OPERATING
IN THE VILLAGE**

WHEREAS, Ohio House Bill 523, which provides for the legalization and regulation of medical marijuana in the State, became effective September 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 3796.29 provides that the legislative authority of a municipality may adopt an ordinance to prohibit medical marijuana cultivators, processors, and dispensaries within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, Council deems it necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the Village and as a business regulation matter to prohibit, with the exception of those licensed facilities indicated in Section 889.02, medical marijuana cultivators, processors, and retail dispensaries within the Village, in accordance with the authority granted to it by Ohio Revised Code Section 3796.29.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Northfield, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That the Council of the Village of Northfield hereby and herein enacts Chapter 889 of the Codified Ordinances as indicated in the attachment hereto.

SECTION 2. That the rest and remainder of the Codified Ordinances shall remain as presently drafted unless inconsistent herewith.

SECTION 3. That all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the deliberation and adoption of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council or any of its legal committees and/or were in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 4. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the public peace, health, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Northfield, for the reason that Council desires that this Ordinance go into effect as soon as possible, and this Ordinance shall take immediate effect upon its signature by the Mayor, or upon the expiration of time within which it may be disapproved by the Mayor, or upon its passage after its disapproval by the Mayor, as the case may be, pursuant to Village of Northfield Charter Section 4.11.

CHAPTER 889
Medical Marijuana Cultivators, Processors, and Retail Dispensaries

889.01 PROHIBITION.

Cultivators, processors, or retail dispensaries of medical marijuana as defined and licensed in Chapter 3796 of the Ohio Revised Code, as it may be amended from time to time, shall be prohibited in the Municipality.

889.02 EXCEPTIONS.

The prohibition set forth in Section 889.01 above shall not apply to licensed facilities involving research related to marijuana conducted at a state university, academic medical center, or by a private research and development organization as part of a research protocol approved by an institutional review board or equivalent entity as provided in Section 3796.29 of the Ohio Revised Code.

**VILLAGE OF NORTHFIELD RESOLUTION NO. 2017-79
AN EMERGENCY RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF ROAD SALT
FROM CARGILL THROUGH THE COMMUNITY UNIVERSITY EDUCATION
PURCHSING ASSOCIATION**

WHEREAS, the Village is a member of the Community University Education Purchasing Association ("CUE"); and

WHEREAS, each year, CUE negotiates optimal prices for members of the Association for the purchase of road salt from a particular vendor for that season; and

WHEREAS, the price negotiated for the current season is \$48.47 per ton; and

WHEREAS, Council desires to authorize the purchase of the Village's allotment of road salt for the current season at the CUE negotiated rate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Northfield, County of Summit, and State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Council hereby and herein authorizes the purchase of the Village's allotment of 960 tons of road salt for the current season from Cargill at the CUE negotiated price of \$48.47 per ton, for a total amount of \$46,531.20.

SECTION 2. That all formal actions of this Council and any actions of its committees that resulted in those formal actions concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in meetings open to the public and/or in compliance with law.

SECTION 3. That this Resolution is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the public peace, health, and welfare of the residents of the Village of Northfield for the reason that it is necessary for the safety of those driving within and through the Village during this winter season, and this Resolution shall take immediate effect upon its signature by the Mayor, or upon the expiration of time within which it may be disapproved by the Mayor, or upon its passage after its disapproval by the Mayor, as the case may be, pursuant to Village of Northfield Charter Section 4.11.

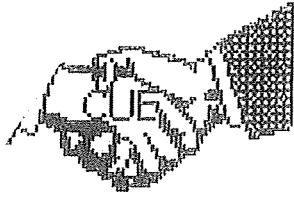
