Road Projects: The Ledge Road reconstruction project is on schedule to be finished before the November 15 deadline. The Coventry Road/Windsor Circle resurfacing project was completed on September 28. The plans for the Presidential Sub-Division resurfacing project are in progress. That project is scheduled to be sent out for bid in early 2017.

Leaf Pick-Up: Village leaf pick-up begins October 31 and will continue until November 30. Pick-up will start on the east side of the Village with Ward C and then move to Ward B. Once those wards are completed, the Service Department will move to the west side of the Village to Ward A and then Ward D. Each street will get only one pick-up. Once a street is completed, the Service Department will not return to pick-up more leaves. If residents have leaves after their street has been serviced, they should bag them for rubbish pick-up. Bags should not weigh more than 40 lbs.

The following leaf pick-up guidelines should be followed:

1. Leaves should not be placed in the street.
2. Leaves should not be placed near drainage ditches or basins to avoid blockage and flooding.
3. Sticks, twigs, rocks, grass clippings, trash, and other materials or yard waste should not be placed in the leaf piles. That activity will clog or damage the leaf machine and delay further pick-ups. If those types of items are found in a pile, the rest of the leaf pile will not be collected.
4. Leaf piles should be placed no farther than 3 feet from the edge of the roadway so that the hose can reach them.
5. If possible, leaves should be placed in long rows parallel to the street rather than tall piles.
6. Leaves should be at least 10 feet away from fire hydrants, utility poles, and mailboxes. Those obstructions make leaf pick-up more difficult and time consuming.

Everyone's cooperation with the above guidelines is appreciated. We are happy to provide this service to our residents, but please keep in mind that this program is tremendously expensive and time consuming. Your assistance will enable the work to be performed more efficiently.

Senior Snow Plowing: Seniors may sign up for Senior Snow Plowing Service through Friday October 28th at the Ledge Road Department of Public Service M-F from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. This year's form is enclosed for people previously enrolled and is also on the Village website on the Building and Zoning page. For those persons that have not already done so, the form should be completed and submitted with the \$5 fee to the Ledge Road office. It is necessary for all residents who qualify for this service to fill out a new application for the 2016-2017 Season no matter if you have received this service in the past. To be eligible, applicants must be at least 65 years of age and not reside with anyone under the age of 65 that is capable of assisting with snow removal duties.
